

## CyLex Rolls Out Document Management

With security concerns, disaster recovery needs and online access cost-justifying electronic document management, more I.T. managers are budgeting for these systems. Catching the tide, Boca Raton, Fla.-based vendor CyLex Systems is marketing its flagship CyLex Express Document Management Service.

Based on the Application Service Provider (ASP) model, and designed exclusively for document management, the CyLex service features 24 by seven accessibility via an Internet connection. Features include input of documents using Scan and Capture software, online document management, search capabilities, document retrieval using View software, user-specific security and online help.

CyLex Express services include Online Document Management, Near-Online Document Management, Archiving and Data Migration.

Zec Aganovic, president of CyLex, estimates the cost of managing and maintaining paper files for a mid-sized company at about \$80,000 per year compared to about \$32,000 per year with CyLex.
