NEW York City-based Head Asset Management L.P., with some \$1 billion in assets under management, has selected Princeton Financial Systems Inc.'s Pam for Securities portfolio management and accounting system. Head Asset—an investment management firm which primarily manages fixed-income securities—finalized its selection of Princeton's Dos-based system in late December.
