## Local Lawmakers Impose a Midnight Curfew on BR Bars

As alcohol-related accilents and violence in Bay Ridge increase, local lawnakers may have found an nnovative answer to the problem.

The City Council has bassed a bill imposing a nidnight curfew on Friday and Saturday nights for all stablishments that serve deahol within the borders of Bay Ridge.

"The image of Bay kidge has been seriously arnished by these repeated neidents," said Councilnan Sal Albanese, who in-

troduced the bill. "This measure will help restore order in the area."

According to 68th Precinct Captain Robert Mescaline, "Throughout the week, Bay Ridge is a relatively quiet and peaceful neighborhood, but when Friday night rolls around all the troublemakers come out of the woodwork."

"Perhaps with this curfew, people will stay home on the weekends," said the captain.

Bar owners will be hardest hit by the curfew, but

will reluctantly comply.

Voice of Bay Ridge Business member Pete Thirstier said, "While most owners feel this measure is too extreme, they do recognize there is a problem."

Thirstier said local restaurants would only serve milk and orange juice past midnight from now on.

Bay Ridge community organizations have been overwhelmingly supportive.
